Regulations Governing Dr. Chuang-yi Ho Memorial Scholarship

Reviewed and approved at the first Department Affairs Council meeting on March 18, 2015

- Article 1. To commemorate Dr. Chuang-yi Ho and to encourage the students of Department of Oceanography (hereinafter "the Department") to develop international perspectives and competitiveness, the Department establishes the Regulations Governing Dr. Chuang-yi Ho Memorial Scholarship (hereinafter "the Regulations").
- Article 2. Eligibility for application: Doctoral students from the Department who have published a paper in English, as the first author, at an international academic conference. Each recipient can receive the scholarship only once every year.
- Article 3. Required documents:
 - 1. Application form
 - 2. Proof of the paper being accepted
 - 3. Abstract or manuscript of the paper
 - 4. Agenda of the academic conference
- Article 4. Recipients visiting the United States, Canada, and European countries receive a scholarship of NT\$10,000, whereas those visiting other regions receive a scholarship of NT\$6,000 (the actual amount may be adjusted according to the budget of the year).
- Article 5. Application deadlines: Each application must be submitted at least 1 month prior to the scheduled conference; applications received after the deadline will not be processed.
- Article 6. Review process: The applicant submits an application to the department office, after which a written notice is issued if the application is approved.
- Article 7. Scholarship issuance: Scholarship recipients must present their flight tickets, a copy of the conference agenda, and a report of conference attendance. After review and approval of the said documents by the department director, recipients can file a claim for reimbursement.
- Article 8. These Regulations become effective upon approval at a Department Affairs Council meeting. Amendments must follow the same procedure.
