- 1. If additional bases are needed, the instructor must submit an application and the departmental scholarship review committee will review the application.
- 2. If the number of students enrolled in a Liberal Education Course exceeds 50, the department will support one base for the general course. If the number of students exceeds 100, the department will support two bases for the general course. The department will support a maximum of two bases for Liberal Education Courses.
- 3. No teaching assistantship is available for Independent Studies. If there is a need for a teaching assistant, please fill out an application form and the departmental scholarship review committee will review the application.
- 4. If a teacher offers the same required course in both Ψ and \mathcal{L} classes (at different times), the teacher may be assigned one additional base in addition to the original teaching assistantship.
- 5. Students enrolled in the course may not serve as teaching assistants for the course.
- 6. Those who want to be TAs (including departmental and PC TAs) are free to attend the TA training held by the University and pass the audit.
- 7. The teacher may flexibly adjust the monthly payment base of the teaching assistants from the Spring Semester of Academic Year 2012, but the maximum number of TAs per person is 3 bases.
- 8. Each department supports the Department of Electrical Engineering's undergraduate courses will have the same base of teaching assistants assigned to full-time professors in the Department of Electrical Engineering.
- 9. The number of students in this course does not include the number of inter-institutional elective courses.
- 10. The English group courses will be allocated additional funding for activities related to teaching and counseling in the English group.
