# **NSYSU Sports Scholarship Evaluation Measures**

- Article 1 The NSYSU Sports Scholarship is established by to encourage students to participate in athletic games or tournaments representing NSYSU (henceforth referred to as the University) or Taiwan and to win honors. Selections and evaluations of outstanding student athletes shall be administered according to these measures (henceforth referred to as the Measures).
- Article 2 Representing NSYSU shall mean any participation in games or tournaments in the university tier with the athlete or team registered in the name of the University. The program of the must indicate the University's name in mentioning the athlete or team. The games or tournaments eligible for applying for the scholarships shall not include The National Games, Citizen Sports Games, City/County Games, and College Sports Exchange Games.
- Article 3 Representing Taiwan shall mean any participation in games or tournaments by athletes or teams elected by Sports Administration, Ministry of Education or any other appointing authority following the established legal procedure. The game or tournament shall consist of at least six athletes (teams) from six countries (regions).
- Article 4 The NSYSU Sports Scholarship Evaluation Committee shall be convened by the Vice President for Student Affairs, and shall comprise the Dean of Si Wan College, Director of Sport Development Division of the Office of Student Affairs, Director of Student Life and Career Development Division of the Office of Student Affairs, and the Director of the Center for Physical and Health Education in the Si Wan College.
- Article 5 Any students of the University with the following three qualifications shall be eligible for application:
  - 1. Athletes achieving outstanding performance while representing the University in the National Intercollegiate Athletic Games, Intercollegiate Sports Tournaments, or championships held by the Chinese Taipei University Sports Federation or other national sports associations; or athletes achieving outstanding performance while

representing Taiwan in major international sports events.

- 2. Athletes notifying and receiving authorization from the Sport Development Division, Office of Student Affairs prior to the game/tournament. (For athletes on representative sporting teams, the notification shall be based on the insurance; for other student athletes, the notification shall be based on the submission of Intercollegiate Sports Game Participation Application Form. Should the athlete fail to notify before the game, or submit late notifications, 40% of Scholarship Point for the game shall be deducted.)
- 3. Athletes being enrolled students of the University during the game/tournament.

# Article 6 The rankings and standards of the NSYSU Sports Scholarship are as follows:

- 1. Scholarship Rank: A+
  - (1) Individual Events
    - a) Winning a place in the top 10% of the total number of athletes in the game.
      - b) Winning a place in the top three in the Finals of national sports games or tournaments and receiving a certificate (trophy) from the organizer.

#### (2) Team Events

- a) Winning a place in the top 20% (inclusive) of the total number of teams in the game.
- b) Winning a place in the top three in the Finals of national sports games or tournaments and receiving a certificate (trophy) from the organizer.
- (3) Classified Tournament
  - a) Top Group: Winning a place in the top 40% (inclusive) of the total number of teams in the game.
  - b) Second Group: Winning a place in the top 20% (inclusive) of the total number of teams in the game.
- (4) International Games

Winning the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, or 3<sup>rd</sup> place

## 2. Scholarship Rank: A

(1) Individual Events

Winning a place in the top 10% - 20% (inclusive) of the total number of athletes in the game.

(2) Team Events

Winning a place in the top 20% - 30% (inclusive) of the total number of teams in the game.

- (3) Classified Tournament
  - a) Top Group: Winning a place in the top 50% (inclusive) of the total number of teams in the game.
  - b) Second Group: Winning a place in the top 30% (inclusive) of the total number of teams in the game.

c) International Games

Winning the 4<sup>th</sup> or 5<sup>th</sup> place

# 3. Scholarship Rank: B

- (1) Individual Events
  - a) Winning a place in the top 10% of the total number of athletes in the game.
  - b) Winning a place in the top eight and in the top 50% (inclusive) of the total number of athletes in the Finals of national sports games or tournaments and receiving a certificate (trophy) from the organizer.

#### (2) Team Events

- a) Winning a place in the top 30%-40% (inclusive) of the total number of teams in the game.
- b) Winning a place in the top eight and in the top 50% (inclusive) of the total number of teams\s in the Finals of national sports games or tournaments and receiving a certificate (trophy) from the organizer.
- (3) Classified Tournament
  - a) Top Group: Winning a place in the top 50%-75% (inclusive) of the total number of teams in the game.
  - b) Second Group: Winning a place in the top 30%-40% (inclusive) of the total number of teams in the game.
- (4) International Games

Winning the 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, or 8<sup>th</sup> place

- 4. Special Commendation: Athletes with approved application and possessing any of the following qualifications shall be awarded the special scholarship. (Accumulative award may apply for the following two qualifications.)
  - a) Winning two gold medals (or more) in one game, or breaking existing record
  - Academic achievement synergy: Student athletes with grades in the top 50% of the class and elite student athletes with grades in the top 70% of the class shall receive
    6 Scholarship Point of academic achievement synergy.

## Article 7 Scholarship Point Allocation

- 1. Scholarship Rank A+: The athlete in individual events shall receive 6 points. For team events, the number of athletes eligible to receiving points shall be the lower number of a) 1.5 times the number of simultaneous in-game players of the team (round up) or b) the maximum number of registered team members on the roster. Each athlete in team events shall receive 6 points.
- 2. Scholarship Rank A: The athlete in individual events shall receive 4 points. For team events, the number of athletes eligible to receiving points shall be the lower number of a) 1.5 times the number of simultaneous in-game players of the team (round up) or b)

- the maximum registered team members. Each athlete in team events shall receive 4 points.
- 3. Scholarship Rank B: The athlete in individual events shall receive 2 points. For team events, the number of athletes eligible to receiving points shall be the lower number of a) 1.5 times the number of simultaneous in-game players of the team (round up) or b) the maximum number of registered team members on the roster. Each athlete in team events shall receive 2 points.
- 4. Special Commendation: The original Scholarship Point allocated for the item shall be multiplied by 1.5. For team events, the point that the individual athlete attains shall be multiplied by 1.5. (The documentary proof of registered athlete in the game shall be attached).
- 5. The items that have received government funding/scholarship/subsidy shall only attain 50% of the Scholarship Point.
- 6. No more than four items may be entered for the application of Sports Scholarship for each game/tournament.
- Article 8 The sum granted to each Scholarship Point may vary and shall be calculated by the Committee according to the funding received for the year and the total number of Scholarship Points approved. Each Scholarship Point should be granted at least NTD 800 and at most NTD 1,000.
- Article 9 Athletes who are eligible should submit the applications form (the team captain shall serve as the representative for team events; the roster of registered team members should be attached) and the documentary proof of the game rankings (the game should take place in the period from June 1st of the previous year to May 31st of the current year). Athletes eligible for the Special Commendation should also provide the proof of academic grades (the grades of the first semester in the current academic year) or proof of breaking game records.

Article 10 The application and evaluation procedure of the Scholarship is as follows:

- 1. Applications and relevant attachments may be submitted to the Sport Development Division from May 10<sup>th</sup> to May 31<sup>st</sup> every year. Should May 31<sup>st</sup> be a holiday, the deadline shall be extended to the next working day.
- 2. Any incomplete applications shall be notified by June 5<sup>th</sup> after the initial review. Upon receipt of the notification, the applicant shall complete the resubmission, make corrections, or provide new documentary evidence before June 10<sup>th</sup>. Should June 10<sup>th</sup> be a holiday, the deadline shall be extended to the next working day.
- 3. Failure to complete resubmission clarifying the missing information within the time limit shall be deemed to have waived the right for resubmission. The events related to the missing information shall not be evaluated for the Scholarship.
- 4. The evaluation process shall be completed and the winners shall be announced before July 31<sup>st</sup>.

- Article 11 Representing the University, as indicated in Item 1 of Article 2, refers to any participation in games or tournaments in the university tier with the athlete or team registered in the name of the University. The program of the must indicate the University's name in mentioning the athlete or team. (The games or tournaments eligible for applying for the scholarships shall not include The National Games, Citizen Sports Games, City/County Games, and College Sports Exchange Games.)
- Article 12 Representing Taiwan, as indicated in Item 1 of Article 2, refers to any participation in games or tournaments by athletes or teams elected by Sports Administration, Ministry of Education or any other appointing authority following the established legal procedure. The game or tournament shall consist of at least six athletes (teams) from six countries (regions).
- Article 13 Should the representative sporting team, in any time of the year, be involved in misconducts, including but not limited to severe violation of the competition laws and regulations, and damage the reputation of the University, the allocated Scholarship Points for the year shall be revoked.
- Article 14The Measures should be practiced after being passed by the University Administration Council Meeting and approved by NSYSU President. The same procedure applies for future amendments.
